Wheelchair access:	Wheelchair access is available on the site with some areas on an incline and uneven surfaces. There is stepped access to many of the shop entrances. Portable ramps are available to allow access to many of the shops and buildings.
Induction loop:	Located in the Visitor Centre, in the cafe and shop.

General information: We use a combination of oral and visual media to communicate our exhibitions and programmes as much as possible. Some parts of the ground floor have low-lighting. There is no background music in the Museum, but some interactives have sound.

All dogs, dogwalkers as well as guide and assistance animals are very welcome within the museum. Drinking bowls are available free of charge from reception.

There are medium size lockers available at the museum. Please ask at reception if you wish to use these.

One personal assistant is permitted free entry to the museum when accompanying a paying visitor (concessionary rate). Due to our adherence to health and safety guidelines, we cannot allow anyone under the age of 16 years to be a personal assistant to another person. We do not allow personal assistants for anybody under the age of 3.

We believe museums are for everyone. However, some people can find visiting new places difficult. We wish to make our museum as accessible and inviting as possible.

Preparing for your visit a few days beforehand can make for a more manageable and enjoyable experience. Therefore, we have created a crystal clear - autism-friendly guide to help young people, teens and adults on the autistic spectrum familiarise themselves with our museum available on the website.

General	Fun Buggies can be hired from our Customer Service Desk located on the Lower Mall. Maximum height recommendation applies. A cash deposit is required with hire charge payable by debit or credit card. Over 60 EV charging bays are located across the site and are chargeable via the providers app.
Shopmobility:	Services are provided by Simple Life mobility on the Upper mall next to Primark.
Parent and baby rooms:	Our dedicated parent and baby rooms are both located on the Upper Mall, one near to NEXT and the other near to Eat Central. We also have a baby changing room located at the toilet facility near to Asda.
